- ☐ Your Advisor and Certifying Officer must authorize your application for graduation for access to the online application. Each will record their authorization by placing specific notes in Degree Works. Once complete, you will have access to the online graduation application on My Info. Need more details? Go here Graduation Application Process.
- Spring and fall term degree candidates must walk in the term they are completing their degree(s). Summer undergraduate candidates are invited to walk in spring ceremonies.
- ☐ Want to attend the ceremony? Find details here: Fall 2024 ceremony.
- ☐ Go to the Office of the Registrar webpage to verify candidacy, RSVP for the graduation ceremony, submit your diploma name, and confirm your diploma mailing address.
- ☐ Learn about MSU regalia history, extras, and exceptions: Regalia Information.
- ☐ Go to the MSU Bookstore Grad Fair Thursday, October 10<sup>th</sup>, 10am 3pm to order regalia.

  The Registrar and other essential offices will be present for questions about graduation.
- ☐ Check My Info for academic or financial holds.
