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TOWN OF JOLIET GOVERNMENT STUDY COMMISSION FINAL REPORT

To the Citizens of Joliet:

The Town of Joliet Study Commission elected by the voters on November 8, 1994, present this final report to the citizens of this town.

The purpose of the study commission, as defined in the state law, is "to study the existing form and powers of our town government and procedures for delivery of local government services and compare them with other forms available under the laws of the state". If some changes is deemed necessary, the study commission may submit such proposed change to the electors.

In the conduct of their review the study commission has sought advice and information from a number of people in the town. Opinions and recommendations were solicited from local government officials, and citizens. All meetings of the study commission were open to the public. Public hearings were held to determine citizen opinion.

As a result of discussions held with the people mentioned the Joliet Town Study Commission has concluded that there is general consensus that the existing mayor town council form of government has served this town well since its incorporation in 1906, and will continue to do so in the future. We therefore recommend no change in this form of government.
